Dear Attorney Douglas:

I have received the petition of Jamie Gerring appealing the response of the Board of Registration in Medicine (BORIM) to a request for public records. G. L. c. 66, § 10A; see also 950 C.M.R. 32.08(1). Specifically, Jamie Gerring requested records concerning “all complaints, disciplines, medical malpractice lawsuits, applications and reapplications, references, resumes, and everything else in your file” associated with an identified individual. BORIM responded on May 20, 2019 providing copies of records. Unsatisfied with BORIM’s response, and believing that “they did not send the documents that exist,” the requestor petitioned this office and this appeal was opened as a result.

Subsequent to the intervention by a staff member of the Public Records Division, I learned that a representative from BORIM is has been made aware of this appeal and intends on providing the requestor with a response focused on addressing the concerns outlined in the appeal. Accordingly, BORIM is ordered to provide the requestor with a written response. Said response shall be made in accordance with the Public Records Law, its Access Regulations and this order within ten business days. It is preferable to send an electronic copy of this response to this office at pre@sec.state.ma.us. The requestor may appeal the substantive nature of BORIM’s response within ninety days. See 950 C.M.R. 32.08(1).
